

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WHAT - HOW - WHO?

What?

The Social Road Map is a brochure handed out by unicum: mensch for people experiencing financial and social hardship, especially (but not only) for women and families. The project began in spring 2005 as part of a course called "A Home of Rich Girls – Ways out of Female Poverty in Austria" and was developed in collaboration with women affected by poverty. After new versions in 2009, 2012, 2016, 2018, and 2020, there is now a seventh updated and expanded version for 2022. The brochure is intended to help people overcome difficulties and find ways out of a crisis. It is addressed to both affected persons and anyone in an advisory role through professional or volunteer work – in other words, it is for anyone who needs a guide to social services for personal use or for helping another person.

How?

The Social Road Map provides assistance and orientation during social and financial hardship. The information in this booklet is sorted by key issues and lets you know where you can get advice and assistance, including contact information, addresses, opening hours, tips for requirements for support and for important documents which need to be taken along, as well as information on getting there by public transport and (sometimes) on barrier-free access to advice centers or government agencies.

You can find general information centers, as well as special services for women and families, children and adolescents. In order to make finding support easier, the institutions are marked on two separate maps. This brochure also contains information on who can provide financial help in cases of acute distress, on which services from public agencies you could use in certain life situations and on legal framework that would apply.

The Social Road Map gives thorough information that is easy to understand. However, the brochure does not contain complete information. All the data and information in this version was researched with the utmost diligence (updated 2022), however, Covid-19 measures could not be taken into account and some potential errors in content cannot be ruled out. TYROL CULTURAL PASS

People facing financial hardship still have the right to art and culture. The Cultural Pass (Kulturpass) grants free entry into many cultural institutions.

How does the Cultural Pass work?

With the Cultural Pass, you can take advantage of offers from participating cultural institutions for free. We recommend that you reserve your tickets in advance.

Who can get the Cultural Pass?

The Cultural Pass is offered to anyone who would like to participate in cultural life, but cannot afford it: people who receive unemployment benefits (less than \in 45,70 daily), emergency unemployment assistance, needs-based guaranteed minimum income or minimum pension, asylum seekers or people whose income falls below the poverty line (\in 1.371 per month).



Where can I get the Cultural Pass?

The Cultural Pass is given out informally at many social organizations and counseling centers, such as: ① Caritas Counseling Center, ③ ISD District Meeting Centers or ④ Info Corner for All Generations. You will need to go in person and bring your photo ID, residence registration and proof of household income.

GENERAL SOCIAL SERVICES

1) Caritas Counseling Center

Services: Social advice, family counseling, support for people going through difficult life situations. These services are for people officially residing within the jurisdiction of the Innsbruck diocese. Homeless people and asylum seekers are excluded from our services – such cases are referred to the \rightarrow **4** Caritas **Social Services at the Train Station** or the \rightarrow **3** Tyrol Social **Services** as well as their partner agencies.

Social counseling services: Advice and support, especially dealing with: guaranteed minimum income, public rent allowance, public family allowance, annual income tax adjustment, exemption from paying for prescriptions, exemption from GIS fees, debt counseling, cult counseling, legal counseling, temporary assistance with financial problems (after reviewing earnings situation).

Family counseling services: Family and life counseling, parenting and youth counseling, pregnancy counseling, open-ended counseling for undecided pregnancies, adoption counseling.

Appointment is required.

2 Red Cross Social Assistance

Services: The volunteer social workers of the Red Cross provide support in self-help during difficult social or emergency situations. Clients are supported in the development of problemsolving strategies. Red Cross employees provide information on help services and can accompany clients to offices, authorities and counseling centers. Social support is free for clients.

In some Innsbruck districts, the ISD is responsible for district coordination in connection with the District Meeting Centers.

Some District Meeting Centers offer specific information and services (Senior Living) to people in old age and their relatives. There are special drop-in centers, Offices for Senior Living, for these purposes in some neighborhoods.

Mobile social work is aimed at seniors with mobility and agerelated limitations in every district. Workers offer low-threshold outreach social counseling within a client's own home to find individual and self-determined solutions. Assistance in social work issues, help with applications, information on issues of social law, counseling for financial benefits, information on services in District Meeting Centers and Offices for Senior Living.

Social Services at the Train Station (Caritas)

Services: Counseling for people without fixed residence, travelers and anyone in need of help. Outreach social work, social law counseling, clarification, referral, last-minute, temporary financial assistance, tickets in certain cases, support in housing & job search.

The Social Counseling Center can put people in contact with other facilities from Dowas: transitional housing, community living, assisted living and apartments for families in emergencies, also DOWAS Social Assistance in Imst and Kufstein.

8 inbus – Counseling for Workers at Risk of Poverty (Innovia)

Services: If you are working, and it still is not enough, then come to us!

inbus offers counseling on how to increase your income, support with applications for financial assistance, and information on training or education possibilities, so that you have more money to live life! inbus is for employed workers who are at risk of poverty. Someone is at risk of poverty if they earn \in 1.371 net monthly income or less. We analyze the income and living situation, and work out a plan together to escape the risk of poverty. It may mean getting further job qualifications which are financed through grants or changing employers – there are many options.

Services are confidential, free and tailored to individual needs. By appointment only. If needed, we can come to you. Counseling also in English.

9 DELO – Eviction Prevention

Services: Free, anonymous counseling and support for renters who are behind in rent payments and are facing eviction. The goal is to enable a person to stay in their apartment with the support of everyone involved, or to find realistic alternatives. Evaluation of the situation, setting a household and financial plan, support in explaining and applying for insurance and social benefits, as well as financial assistance, information on rental and legal matters, contact information, conflict resolution and mediation with owners, authorities and property management, support for creating a payment plan, crisis intervention, referrals and information on specialized institutions and services.

Services: Three areas under one roof for youth ages 14-21 years.

Drop-in center: Snacks and alcohol-free drinks, wash and shower facilities, washing machine and dryer, lockers, leisure activities, internet access, options for setting up a mailing address, etc.

Social counseling services: Evaluation of problems and support in crisis: livelihood security, assistance in housing search and rental, search for a place in assisted living, advice and support with job search, including evaluation of educational prospects; debt regulation measures, information and counseling for alcohol and drug problems, information and counseling about criminal offense, etc. Counseling is confidential and free.

People who have been the primary caregiver for a close relative for at least one year can apply for a subsidy. This should be the amount to cover the proven costs that the main caretaker had to pay for the substitute care.

Another requirement is the person receiving care must have received the care allowance (Pflegegeld) for at least one year at level 3–7 in accordance with the Federal Care Allowance Act (Bundespflegegeldgesetz) (level 1 in cases of dementia or underage relatives). Support for the cost of professional or private substitute care for at least one to four weeks maximum per calendar year. The subsidy amount depends on the care level, max. \in 1.200 to \in 2.200. If the duration of substitute care is shortened, then the subsidy will be reduced.

In the case of dementia and underage relatives, the maximum subsidy is raised by \in 300 and can be requested after four days of substitute care.

With the subsidy model of the Ministry of Social Affairs, people in need of care or their relatives can receive financial support for people with disabilities.

Care must take place in a private household in accordance with the provisions of the Home Care Act. After request is processed, you are notified in writing whether you will receive assistance and how much. Overdue payments of any kind are directly transferred (e.g. rent, electricity; does not cover security deposits).



LEGAL FRAMEWORK

In this section, you can find information on which public agencies can help you in certain life situations and what kind of legal framework exists. It provides an overview of:

- Support options when you become unemployed
- Guaranteed minimum income
- Available help and responsible institutions if livelihood is no longer affordable
- Financial coverage in case of illness
- Support for pregnancy and birth of a child, as well as childcare
- Information for people with disabilities

TIPS: The purpose of the information in this section is to give you an orientation to public agencies and authorities which can offer support services. However, it does not replace visits in person to these institutions.

Most institutions mentioned in this section are public offices which communicate with each other and can work together to offer you support.

The provided information relies mostly on legal regulations (updated 2022), but short-term measures due to the Covid-19 situation cannot be taken into account. The type of support actually available to you might change in the following years, and it often depends on your individual situation. Your support options may be different in reality from the general information given in the Social Road Map.

UNEMPLOYMENT

The following information offers guidance to support available through the AMS (Public Employment Service Austria). It does not replace visits in person to the AMS and may not have complete information.

Visit the AMS no later than on your first day of unemployment (bring along e-Card and ID). – Pay close attention to all deadlines at the AMS which apply to you in order to avoid financial losses.

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS / EMERGENCY UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCEE

Which requirements must I meet?

Basic requirements: be unemployed, willing to work, able to work, available for the job market for at least 20 hours per week (if taking care of a child younger than 10 or children with disabilities: 16 hours per week, if you can show proof that longer childcare options do not exist).

Minimum period of employment (required amount of time paying into unemployment insurance): at point of first application, 52 weeks within the last 24 months (for people under age 25: 26 weeks within the last 12 months); upon further applications: 28 weeks in the last 12 months.

What do I have to do?

Register as unemployed and seeking work at the AMS: In person or online with eAMS-login data (access code required, therefore request in advance!); registration with the AMS is also possible before unemployment begins – and is recommended. To avoid gaps that could affect your social benefits or insurance, you must register your unemployment at the latest on the first day you become unemployed. Apply for unemployment benefits: After registering as unemployed, you can apply for unemployment benefits. BE AWARE: Application can only be done in person at the AMS or through an eAMS online account* (Applications for emergency unemployment assistance: in person or through an eAMS online account). Applications cannot be applied retroactively – Therefore, it is wise to apply for unemployment benefits, even if you are not sure if you qualify. If your application is rejected, you will need a written notification in order to appeal the decision. Application forms are available at the AMS or online.

Which documents do I need?

- Bring your e-Card to every AMS appointment.
- Personal documents (official photo ID, proof of citizenship/ residence permit, marriage certificate/divorce certificate/ settlement papers), and other forms of proof indicated on the application; for child custody: child birth certificates, school attendance or enrollment confirmation/apprenticeship contract, proof of child benefit eligibility; for children not living in the same household: proof of parenthood, current proof of spousal support payments and the amount.

Additional documents (if available) for emergency unemployment assistance will depend on individual circumstances: for example, proof of income.

You are required to report any changes! All types of work while receiving unemployment benefits or emergency unemployment assistance must be reported to the AMS immediately; also any changes to the income situation (personal, as well as for spouse or partner), relocation, periods abroad, sick leave/hospital stays, etc.

^{*} Access code required, therefore request in advance.

The return deadline on the application must be adhered to, even if you do not have all the required documents available – in this case, call the Service Line 050/904740 to extend the return deadline.

How long do I get unemployment benefits?

Depending on age and length of employment before becoming unemployed, 20–52 weeks, or longer if you attend certain training programs. If your right to unemployment benefits has ended, then you can apply for emergency unemployment assistance. You can receive emergency unemployment assistance indefinitely, but it is approved for a maximum of 52 weeks at a time. (Each time requires a new application.)

What do I get?

Unemployment benefits or emergency unemployment assistance; health and retirement insurance through the AMS.

Amount of unemployment benefits: Depends on net income of the last 12 months; family bonus for children or partner without income or whose income is under the marginal earnings limit. Exemption from paying for prescriptions/e-Card service fees, GIS fee exemption, as well as rent subsidies are possible. Reasonable job positions must be accepted, assigned courses/training must be attended, otherwise no benefits for 6–8 weeks and benefit period will be shortened. Must show up for appointments or risk losing benefits until you show up and a shortened benefit period.

If you quit or are fired: for the first 4 weeks after your job ends, you don't get money (benefits are delayed, but overall period of benefits will not be shortened).

Amount of emergency unemployment assistance: Depends on unemployment benefits and the time period in which you received them, takes economic circumstances into account (own income, income of spouse or domestic partner). Marginal additional earnings are possible (max. € 485,85 gross income/month, updated 2022) – additional earnings and any changes in economic circumstance **must be reported!**

TIPS:



Self-employed ... can voluntarily join unemployment insurance under certain conditions. Information: Austrian Social Insurance Authority for Business (SVA). <u>www.svs.at/cdscontent/</u>

Advance pension payment ... is possible when applying for early retirement due to reduced ability to work, for retirement as soon as you meet the legal age requirement, or for special early retirement (in accordance with regulations for heavy night work); the advance is paid until the retirement application process is finished. Same requirements as with unemployment benefits/emergency unemployment assistance (except willing and able to work).

Transitional workplaces ... offer the opportunity for temporary employment in socioeconomic businesses or work projects for people who are long-term unemployed or who are difficult to employ.

GUARANTEED MINIMUM INCOME

The following information offers an introduction to the guaranteed minimum income (previously basic benefits or social welfare). This information may not be complete!

The minimum income helps where all other options for support are exhausted, do not apply, or are not sufficient. You must be able to prove that you attempted to obtain support.

Which requirements must I meet?

You are currently or will soon be in distress. You cannot earn a living on your own (e.g. due to unemployment or illness); your income is insufficient (e.g. unemployment benefits, emergency unemployment assistance, sick pay, pension, spousal or child support ...); no savings over \in 4.889,70 (updated 2022); must show willingness to work: reasonable work, AMS or language courses. (There is the possibility of reimbursement for training costs, travel costs to and from the course, and examination fees for German courses.)

The rate of benefits is not fixed, but depends on your income/ expenses. Certain portions of income and assets are not included in the calculations of guaranteed minimum income (e.g. child benefits, disability benefits, some income in cases of limited ability to work or single parents caring for school-aged children). Receipt of guaranteed minimum income without Austrian citizenship is possible; there are different criteria/requirements, such as mandatory attendance of courses; before you apply, it is very important that you get information from the Social Welfare Office or a counseling center. An application for social benefits can in some cases endanger your Austrian residency permit or prevent you from getting Austrian citizenship! You have the right to minimum income even without a registered address (e.g. when homeless).

Which documents do I need?

(As copies) Photo ID; residency permit; bank account transaction list with the balance from the last three months (available at the bank counter, account printouts are not sufficient!); income documents from applicant(s) and from all persons living and working in the same household (pay slips, AMS documents, pension letters, maintenance expenses, rent allowance, housing allowance, sick pay, childcare allowance, rehabilitation allowance, etc.); rental contract and current proof of rent divided into rent and utility costs; other case-related documents and proof of assets (divorce settlement, savings account, life insurance, vehicle registration, etc.); for persons unable to work: proof of trying to find work (e.g. AMS appointment card, proof of job interviews, etc.); for recognized refugees: proof of integration efforts (German course certificates, job search) and proof of amount of basic social benefits; for EU and Swiss citizens: registration certificate after the 4th month of residence or proof of legal residency.

What do I get?

The guaranteed minimum income should cover your livelihood and housing costs. There is a fixed monthly minimum sum under guaranteed minimum income laws in Tyrol, which should be provided for the living expenses (including electricity costs and clothing) – if your personal income is below this amount, then the guaranteed minimum income can help out. For housing costs, there are additional benefits.

Minimum rate (excerpt, updated 2022):

- Single person or single parent: € 733,46
- Single adults or single parents in shared living: € 550,09
- Adults with spouse or partner in a supported living ("Bedarfsgemeinschaft"): € 550,09
- Additional (dependent) adults in the same household, e.g. adult children living with parents: € 366,73
- Minors living in the same household: depending on the number of children, between € 242,04 and € 117,35

Bonus payments for eligible groups are given in March, June, September and December, if you received guaranteed minimum income for 3 months in a row before receiving bonus payments: $\in 88,01$.

Housing costs:

- Capped by district → Maximum upper limits for rent in Innsbruck, e.g. for one person € 581; for two persons € 726 (updated 2022). The difference must be paid by yourself. Also, costs in connection with apartment rental are only proportionally covered. (There is no legal right to have realtor costs covered.)
- Costs for basic apartment set up (furniture, household goods) may be covered.

• Costs for modification or renovation/repair (e.g. washing machine, stove, floors, etc.) may be covered after consultation with the Department of Social Affairs.

You **must clear** all housing-related expenses (also if renting an apartment) with the Department of Social Affairs and get permission in advance!

Allocation law:

The authorities can assign you to housing – it may not be an apartment, it could also be a home or shared living community! Legal remedies (appeals) cannot delay the outcome. If the assigned housing is not taken within 4 weeks, then support for housing costs will not be paid for the next 6 months \rightarrow check with a counseling center!

→ For more information on housing-related support: rent allowance/housing allowance → counseling centers

Health insurance:

A person receiving guaranteed minimum income is insured, receives an e-Card and is exempt from paying for prescriptions.

TIPS:



Application and Decision: File a written application (forms are available at advice centers and the Social Welfare Office) and fill out the application as accurately as possible. Request a written decision. Appealing the decision (if negative or lower than requested) is possible within 4 weeks.

Limits to Guaranteed Minimum Income: If the emergency situation is caused by deliberate or reckless actions, then the guaranteed minimum income may be reduced to a minimum; also in case of failure to attend courses, etc.

Repayment:

Paying back the guaranteed minimum income is required under certain conditions (up to 3 years afterwards), for example, if you suddenly gain wealth (e.g. inheritance), if repayment will not cause new distress, or if you give incorrect or withhold information. Therefore, report any changes!

Exemption from Radio and Television Fees (GIS) / Subsidies for Telephone Fees

Which requirements must I meet?

Legal age of adulthood, residency in Austria, recipient of guaranteed minimum income, pension, care allowance, benefits in accordance with unemployment insurance law, Labor Market Promotion Act or the Public Employment Service Act, student grants, childcare allowance, etc., including persons who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Income thresholds (net income, updated 2022): \in 1.154,15 for single-person households, \in 1.820,80 for two persons; for each additional person \in 178,08. Expenses which can be taken into account if the income limits are exceeded: rent costs (including utilities), recognized outstanding hardship, costs of 24-hour care.

Application for GIS exemption: TV/radio must have already been registered and fees already paid!

Which documents do I need?

Application form, registration certificate and proof of income from all members of household; additional documents vary depending on reason for application (retirees, minimum income recipients, recipients of disability benefits, AMS etc.). Application and information can be found online at <u>www.gis.at</u> or at any Raiffeisen bank and City Hall.

What do I get?

If approved: exemption from GIS fees for radio/TV (for a limited time, then a new application and proof are required); for the subsidy: voucher that must be forwarded to the phone company (be aware of the validity period!).

Which requirements must I meet?

Primary residence in Innsbruck, recipient of guaranteed minimum income or minimum pension.

Which documents do I need?

Current decision from Innsbruck Social Welfare Office; for minimum pension: once a year show the updated decision; photo identification.

What do I get?

Subsidized Ticket = IVB monthly tickets for central Innsbruck zone at a reduced price of \in 22 (updated 2022); non-transferable, valid only in combination with photo identification; available at IVB customer center on Stainerstraße. This monthly ticket is only valid within the Innsbruck core zone!

RENT AND HOUSING ALLOWANCE

→ Counseling centers for housing topics are found in the chapters "General Social Services" (p. 6–8) and "Housing/ Work" (p. 9–14)

The following information provides an introduction to rent and housing subsidies. For specific information and all necessary forms \rightarrow see CONTACT. This section may not have complete information!

This allowance is a subsidy from the state or local community to help cover housing costs. If your income is low in comparison to the cost of housing, you may receive an allowance. Depends on: household size (number of people) and income. Depending on your living situation, you can apply for a rent or housing allowance:

- Rent allowance (annuities subsidy): Help paying rent (or annuities, e.g. installments to pay back loans) of non-sub-sidized housing (housing which is not socially supported). Apply at the City Administration (*Magistrat*).
- Housing allowance: Help paying rent (or annuities) for subsidized rental or owned apartments or compact housing (terrace house, duplex, apartment complex). No allowance given for apartments provided by employers, group homes or apartments which are supported through housing or purchasing vouchers (apartments at least 10 years old). Apply at the Tirol Government Office, Department of Housing Subsidies.

Which requirements must I meet?

- Rent allowance (in Innsbruck): Primary residence in Innsbruck for at least 2 years for EU citizens or equivalent status, or 5 years for third country relatives. Primary residence in Innsbruck totaling at least 15 years (non-consecutively), will be checked in follow-up applications! (Meanwhile, it is possible in some cases to receive a temporary allowance to help you get by.)
- Housing allowance: Austrian citizenship (or equivalent) or at least 5 years primary residence in Tyrol; regular use of the apartment by the person receiving the allowance; apartment owner or direct rental from the owner. Minimum age 18 years, Austrian citizenship (or equivalent or at least 5 years primary residency in Tyrol); regular use of apartment by subsidy recipient; ownership of apartment or renting directly from owner.

Which documents do I need?

- Application form (available online).
- Proof of total household income (all members of household): Income tax statement/annual income overview, income tax statement from the previous year; depending on the situa-

tion, confirmation (copy) of unemployment benefits, guaranteed minimum income, childcare allowance, child or spousal support or other earnings.

- Proof of cost of living: Registered rent agreement (for first application, copy), proof of rent or annuity (as requested; form), receipt of rent deposit (money transfer order/bank statement), registration certificate (copy); sworn statement, details on housing situation as requested; perhaps copy of disability card.
- For other documents specific to your situation, see application form!

Apply well in advance!

If you **apply by the 3**rd **business day of the month**, the application will count for that month. Otherwise, it will count for the month following the application! Payment at end of the month. The application for a housing subsidy can be filed **at the earliest 3 months before the expected completion of the building project.** Following applications must be filed at the latest 3 months before the subsidies expire to ensure continuous subsidy payments. The subsidy is generally granted for one year.

What do I get?

Monthly benefits. Amount depends on income, number of people, apartment size and estimated burden of housing expenses (depending on income). In principle, benefits are paid for one year, and then a following application must be filed.

Notification Requirement: Immediately report any changes in family or income status, otherwise subsidy can be discontinued. Wrongfully received subsidies must be paid back. File a new application when changing apartments.

TIP:

Different regulations apply to students or to rental situations involving "closely related persons".

The following information offers an overview of benefits in case of illness. Information is not complete!

Österreichische Gesundheitskasse (ÖGK) – Health Insurance

Which requirements must I meet?

You **must** have health insurance: either *mandatory insurance* (automatically through work/income), *co-insurance* through a relative (apply!), or *voluntary self-insurance* (apply!).

- Mandatory insurance: Employees and free contractors who are properly registered and have an income over the marginal earnings limit (€ 485,85 monthly, updated 2022) are insured. Recipients of benefits such as pension, unemployment benefits, emergency unemployment assistance, needs-based minimum income and any childcare allowance, maternity pay or sick pay are automatically insured.
- Co-insurance: Option to get health insurance for relatives (partners, children) – there might be additional charges – info/ application at the ÖGK.
- Self-insurance: Option for persons without mandatory or coinsurance – info/application at the ÖGK! For incomes under the marginal earnings limit, voluntary self-insurance is possible ("opting in" costs € 68,59 monthly, updated 2022). Persons with work contracts or who are newly self-employed must register their work with the SVA – insurance is mandatory above a certain income level.

Which documents do I need?

- Mandatory insurance: None; registration is automatically done by employer and authorities (Be careful if you have more than one job under the marginal earnings limit that all together exceed the limit → you will owe back payments for mandatory insurance in the following year. Monthly payment possible.)
- Co-insurance: Questionnaire at the ÖGK (or online), to verify whether relatives qualify, go to www.gesundheitskasse.at – Formulare (forms)
- Voluntary self-insurance: Application forms at ÖGK (or online), necessary documents depending on your situation (see forms) – be aware of possible waiting period.

Notification Requirement for self-insurance: Changes in family status, address, new job qualifying for mandatory insurance, etc. must be reported to the Health Insurance Office within 7 days!

ADVICE:



For changes in life situation, for example, switching from one job to another, find out if you are insured same as before!

What do I get?

 Medical care from doctors and institutions (clinics) contracted with the ÖGK. Partially paid bills at private doctors (must be requested); free annual checkups. Covered costs for necessary hospital stays (90 % for co-insured relatives). Be aware of meal costs! In hospitals without a contract with ÖGK, you need to clear the duration and cost of stay **in advance** and request additional coverage of costs from the ÖGK **in advance**!

- (In some cases) costs for remedies, therapeutic aids, glasses, braces and artificial teeth, and rehabilitation treatment may be covered.
- For long-term illness: Sick pay as (partial) compensation for missed income.

Sick note ("Krankmeldung") / sick leave ("Krankenstand"): Employees are required to immediately notify employer of illness: see a doctor on the 1st day (or request a home visit), get a sick note and notify your employer! Otherwise there is a risk of lost income.

RECOMMENDED:

If several illnesses occur around the same time and you are often taking sick leave, it is recommended that you go to the Work Council (*"Betriebsrat"*), Chamber of Labour or ÖGK Case Management for consultation.

e-card (Annual fee € 12,95, updated 2022); take your e-Card to every doctor's visit, it contains all important insurance data and any exemption from paying for prescriptions. Possibility of activating the e-Card as a Civil Card: <u>www.bürgerkarte.at</u>

Maternity services: For benefits involving pregnancy and birth (maternity pay, childcare allowance, Mother-Child-Booklet) \rightarrow see "**Pregnancy, Birth, Life with Children**" (p. 70–77)

Exemption from Prescription Costs

Which requirements must I meet?

Persons with "special social needs for protection" are exempt without applying (for example, recipients of minimum retirement, persons with illnesses that are required to be registered, persons doing civil service, asylum seekers).

Application: Income limits (monthly net income, updated 2022): € 1.030,49 for single persons (€ 1.185,06 in cases of above-average expenses due to pain or disability), € 1.625,71 for married couples (€ 1.869,57); for children not receiving child support who live in the same household, an additional € 159 per child.

Income from partners and other household members will be considered.

Which documents do I need?

- Application forms (at ÖGK or online at <u>www.gesundheitskasse.at</u> → Formulare [forms])
- Einkommensnachweis (aller Haushaltsmitglieder),
- Proof of income (of all household members)
- Medical confirmation of additional costs due to illness/ medication (+ medication list from doctor)

Application also applies for exemption from e-Card fees.

TIP:

If you qualify for exemption from prescription costs, you can also apply for exemption from radio and television fees (GIS) and from telephone fees \rightarrow see p. 65

ÖGK Support Funds

There are no legal entitlements to these support funds!

Financial support for insured persons who face financially distress because of especially high medical costs. This is a *voluntary service of the ÖGK* depending on individual family situations, income and assets.

Which requirements must I meet?

You may apply for unlimited funding. However, the costs of submitted benefits must total at least \in 40 (can be submitted all together).

Which documents do I need?

- Application form (<u>www.gesundheitskasse.at</u> → Formulare [forms])
- Original receipt with proof of payment (you must first **pay by yourself**!)
- Prescription (copy)
- Complete proof of income of all household members

🔶 What do I get?

If approved, (partial) compensation of costs, for example, for therapeutic aids and remedies, for hearing aids (if lost or stolen), for hospitalization of relatives, for artificial teeth, repairs, corrective jaw treatment etc.; written notice if the application is approved or denied.

PREGNANCY, BIRTH, LIFE WITH CHILDREN

The following information gives an introduction to possible support. This information is not complete!

Pregnancy / Mandatory Maternity Protection

What do I have to do?

Suspected pregnancy or positive pregnancy test: see a doctor for confirmation of pregnancy as soon as possible. You will get a Mother-Child-Booklet (see below), which contains the specific check-ups at certain times during the pregnancy and after the birth (free!).

Employed workers: If the pregnancy is confirmed, immediately inform your employer! Labor laws come into effect as soon as the pregnancy is reported \rightarrow maternity regulations (see below). 4 weeks before the beginning of \rightarrow mandatory leave (=12 weeks before the due date) inform your employer again. A premature end of pregnancy must be reported to your employer!

Which documents do I need?

- For medical care: e-Card. If you don't have health insurance, contact the Austrian health insurance office (ÖGK) in person; you will get a slip substituting an e-Card for examinations in the Mother-Child-Booklet.
- For work: Medical certificate of pregnancy and expected due date, if requested by employer.

Maternity Regulations

An employee is protected against dismissal, discharge and hazardous work as soon as pregnancy is reported.

Other regulations apply for fixed-term employment contracts, independent contracts, or probation periods; check with AK Tyrol before reporting your pregnancy (1000/225522).

Entrepreneurs, newly self-employed and farmers have their own regulations which apply. The following websites can provide more information. Commercial Insurance: <u>http://www.svs.at</u>

Mandatory Maternity Protection: Working is prohibited from 8 weeks before the expected due date, day of birth until at least 8 weeks after the birth (for premature, multiple or cesarean births: 12 to max. 16 weeks) – during this time, you are entitled to \rightarrow maternity pay (see below).

Mother-Child-Booklet: Available for every pregnant woman (also non-Austrians), scheduled examinations with doctors with public health contracts are free.

Proof of examinations is required in order to fully receive the \rightarrow childcare allowance! The first examination must be done before the end of the 16th week of pregnancy.

Wochengeld

= financial support replacing missed income during mandatory maternity protection.

What do I have to do?

Apply for maternity pay with your health insurance provider (in person or by mail). Application can be filed starting at 8 weeks before the beginning of mandatory maternity protection.

Which requirements must I meet?

Valid health insurance at the start of mandatory leave. Other regulations apply for entrepreneurs, newly self-employed and farmers (\rightarrow see: <u>https://www.svs.at</u>).

Which documents do I need?

- Medical certificate with expected due date; confirmation of work and income or proof of unemployment benefits, emergency unemployment assistance (A1VG Benefits).
- After the birth: Birth certificate, hospital certificate of premature, multiple or cesarean birth, confirmation of hospital stay.

What do I get?

Maternity pay to replace missed income 8 weeks before and 8 weeks (or 12, max. 16) after the birth.

Amount of maternity pay is calculated from net income (average from the last 3 months) + proportional bonus payments.

Marginally employed women who are self-insured get fixedrate maternity pay (€ 9,78 per day, updated 2022).

Recipients of benefits according to AIVG: Maternity pay is 180% of the amount of benefits last received.

TIP:

Additional income next to maternity pay can (partly) suspend maternity pay. The period of entitlement to benefits cannot be extended!

Birth – Birth Certificate, Registration

What do I have to do?

- Register child's birth at the Civil Registry Office/City Administration: notification of birth must be done within the first week, birth certificate will be issued.
- Register residence of child at Registration Office/City Administration: registration forms are available online, in the hospital or to pick-up at the Registration or Civil Registry Offices. It is possible to turn in the registration of residence at the same time as the notification of birth, and can already be done in the hospital otherwise, 3 days after returning home at the latest.
- Proof of fatherhood in cases of children born outside of marriage: can be recognized by the father's signature in person at the Civil Registry Office (no deadline, can also be done before birth).

TIP:

Unlike with the registration, the child must be present to get a person ID or passport. This also applies to newborns and is free of charge.

Which documents do I need?

- For notification of birth and to receive a birth certificate: Documents of both parents: birth certificate, registration, proof of citizenship (for foreign nationalities: passport or proof of nationality); marriage certificate (in cases of divorce or death of one parent: divorce or death certificate), if applicable, proof of fatherhood, proof of academic degrees; form for "Notification of Birth".
- In cases of children born outside of marriage without a recognized father: mother's documents.
- For registration confirmation: completed registration form (online, in hospital, at the City Administration).

Important: Documents in a foreign language must be originals and be accompanied by a translation notarized in Austria. **Find out which regulations apply.**

TIP:



Often births in the hospital are automatically reported, but in certain circumstances, parents must bring documents to the Civil Registry Office in order to get the birth certificate – find out at the hospital!

Babies and children need a passport or ID card (within the EU) in order to cross borders!



Childcare Allowance

Updated 2022

The information here is not complete and only gives a rough overview!

Free hotline for information on childcare allowance: Mon–Thu 9:00–15:00 **a** 0800/240014

There are two models of childcare allowance – a childcare allowance account (*KBG-Konto*) and an income-based childcare allowance (*ea KBG*). Amount and duration depend on the model and variation! Additional income limits and additional benefits also vary. Before deciding on a model of childcare allowance, inform yourself and carefully consider which model works best for you. The chosen model applies to both parents. Partnership bonus for parents who split the childcare allowance about evenly.

The model you choose on the application can't be changed, except for within the first 14 days after turning it in.

Information, forms and a comparison calculator can be found on the following websites:

What do I have to do?

Apply at the Health Insurance Office – earliest possible is on the day of birth; you must select a model on the application. Childcare allowance is only given for the youngest child, and you must turn in a new application after each birth! Retroactive (can be done afterward) for a maximum 182 days.

Which requirements must I meet?

Parent(s)/child must have their center of life in Austria; legal residency in Austria; parent(s) and child share a household; recipient of family allowance; proof of \rightarrow Mother-Child-Booklet doctor visits (or else amount of childcare allowance will be reduced), pay attention to limits on additional income. If parents are separated, they must have custody rights to the child. To choose the income-based model (*ea KBG*), you must have been actively employed in Austria, at a job with mandatory health and pension insurance, without interruption for at least 182 days before the birth of your child.

Which documents do I need?

- Birth certificate
- Mother-Child-Booklet doctor visits
- Application form (<u>www.gesundheitskasse.at</u> → Formulare)
- For separated parents: custody rights to the child and must applicant must receive family allowance ("Familienbehihilfe")
- For non-citizens of Austria: passport of applicant and child, proof of legal residency or asylum decision.

What do I get?

Income-based childcare allowance (ea KBG): Benefits period max. 12 months (+ 2 months, if both parents take parental leave); amount depends on the income before birth (80 % of maternity pay, max. € 66 per day); no additional benefits for multiple births; calculated individually for each parent. Childcare allowance account (KBG-Konto): Amount depends on duration of benefits (updated 2022): depending on duration of benefits between \notin 14,53 and \notin 33,88; for multiple births, the amount increases by 50 % per additional child; for low-income parents, additional allowance \notin 6,06 per day is possible for fixed-rate models for max. 12 months (must apply!).

For both models: Health insurance for recipient of KBG and child; extended period of benefits if both parents take parental leave; single parents going through hard times may receive an extension (must apply!). Pay attention to limits on additional income!

Partnership bonus: If both parents receive childcare allowance for about the same amount of time (50:50 to 40:60) and the duration for each parent is at least 124 days long, then each parent can apply for the partnership bonus. Each partner receives a one-time payment of \in 500. Apply at the ÖGK latest within the 124 days after the last allowance payment for both parents.

TIP:

Difference between "Childcare Allowance" & "Leave of Absence": *Childcare Allowance* (family benefits): money; apply at the Health Insurance Office. *Leave of Absence* (worker's right): time off from work max. until child's 2nd birthday; protection from getting fired; give written notification to employer.

Settlement Office:

Family Leave Bonus

Financial support for the father or second parent to take a break from work directly after birth for family time.

Requirements: Recipient of family allowance, center of life in Austria, shared household/primary residence with the child and other parent, employment with mandatory health and pension insurance for the 182 days before the start of receiving the family leave bonus, must return directly to the job at the end of the family time. Family time and receipt of the family leave bonus must match up exactly, without receiving other benefits. Apply at the ÖGK. You must apply for and use the Family leave bonus within the first 91 days after the birth.

Duration/amount: 28–31 days, € 22,60 per day.

The family leave bonus cannot be taken in addition to the childcare allowance. If the father, or second parent, takes the childcare allowance later, it will be reduced by the family leave bonus. There is no legal right to the family leave bonus. Make arrangements with your employer. Some collective agreements allow for a leave of absence \rightarrow Advice from the Worker's Council (*Betriebsrat*), Chamber of Labour (*Arbeiterkammer*), labor union (*Gewerkschaft*)

Family Allowance

What do I have to do?

No application necessary for in-country births, otherwise apply at the tax office in your place of residence.

Which requirements must I meet?

Residence and center of life in Austria; Austrian citizenship (or legal residency); parent(s) and child live together in same household; child is a minor; once a child turns 18 years old, family allowance will only be paid under certain circumstances until max. 24th birthday (in some exceptions, until 25), e.g. disability, occupational training or studying at university (limited additional earnings!) or pregnancy. The mother is entitled to the family allowance, unless otherwise determined. *Military service / training / civil service:* During this time, not entitled to family allowance, but afterward, period of benefits will be extended.

Which documents do I need?

Application form (online or at tax office); for adult children proof of education / continuing education, study program / academic completion, military service / training / civil service.

What do I get?

Amount of family allowance (updated 2012) depends on the age and number of children ($\in 114 - \in 165,10$ monthly); bonus for significantly disabled children; multiple child bonus for families with at least 3 children and a family income under $\in 55.000,-$ per year (annual income tax adjustment!); back-to-school allowance in September $\in 100,00$ for children aged 6–15; child tax credit.

Childcare assistance from the AMS while working

No legal entitlement!

To get assistance, you must have a counseling session well BEFORE starting work or training and BEFORE placing your child in childcare.

What do I have to do?

Counseling session and application at the AMS before starting work or training and before placing your child in childcare.

Which requirements must I meet?

- Shared household with child; child is younger than 15 years old (under 18 in case of disability).
- Need for childcare must be due to working, e.g. by starting a new job, participating in labor market policy-related training measures (e.g. courses), deteriorating economic situation of family despite employment, need for a new childcare facility due to significant changes in work hours, loss of previous childcare provider.
- Income limits (updated 2022): total monthly gross income (brutto) cannot be over € 2.700.

What do I get?

Subsidized care for a preschool, daycare center, children's group, in-home daycare provider, or private persons; does not apply to relatives or au-pairs!

Amount of assistance depends on: family income, estimated childcare costs and duration and type of care; max. \in 300/month.

Assistance is possible for 26 weeks at a time; maximum period per child: 156 weeks.

Bus and tram stops (IVB): Franz-Fischer-Straße (1, STB), Michael-Gaismair-Straße (M, 505)

TIP:

Parents who do not receive assistance from the AMS and fulfill certain requirements (income limits, not getting childcare allowance for the child, out-of-home childcare, child under 14 years), can apply for a childcare subsidy from the Province of Tyrol! Application form online.

Child Benefit Plus: Support from the Province of Tyrol for parents with children ages 2 and 3 (who turn 2 and 3 years old before 02 September, until the start of half-day free kindergartens) with primary residence in Tyrol. Income limits based on household income from the previous year. Application online.

DISABILITY

Disability Pass

Photo ID to show proof of disability and to obtain various benefits. Issued for free.

Which requirements must I meet?

People are eligible for a Disability Pass if they have a disability degree (GdB) or reduced ability to work (MdE) of at least 50 %, and if they live in or regularly stay in Austria.

What do I have to do?

Apply at the Ministry of Social Affairs. Application form: <u>https://www.sozialministeriumservice.at/</u> <u>Menschen mit Behinderung/Behindertenpass und</u> Parkausweis/Behindertenpass/Behindertenpass.de.html

Which documents do I need to turn in with the application?

Current medical records, e.g. diagnostic results or medical opinions (not older than 2 years), a color EU passport photo in accordance with ICAO regulations, valid residence permit (for citizens from non-EU countries), current care allowance confirmation (if care allowance is received), copy of registration.

How does the Disability Pass benefit me?

- Fare reduction on ÖBB and public transportation with a disability degree of 70 %
- Flat-rate tax exemption starting at 25 % disability degree (except for year-round care allowance) and/or covered food costs (with additional note in the Disability Pass)

- Discounts at leisure and cultural institutions (please check before buying tickets!)
- **Possible exemption from tuition fees** (check with your educational institution).

A Disability Pass with the note "Public transport use unreasonable due to permanent mobility restrictions from disability" gives additional benefits: exemption from driving-related insurance taxes, auto club member discounts at ARBÖ and ÖAMTC, Euro-Key – a key to use the restrooms reserved for people with disabilities, free motorway toll sticker. Be aware: Vehicle must be approved for the person with a disability.

Parking Permit according to § 29b StVO

Issuance of permits according to § 29b of the Street Traffic Act (StVO), short-term parking permits, from the Ministry of Social Affairs. Issued for free.

Which requirements must I meet?

People with a Disability Pass are eligible for a parking permit under § 29b StVO if they have the additional note "Public transport use unreasonable due to permanent mobility restrictions from disability".

What do I have to do?

Request a parking permit from the Ministry of Social Affairs. The appropriate application form can be downloaded from the homepage: <u>www.sozialministeriumservice.at</u>.

Alternatively, you can also apply directly at the Ministry of Social Affairs Regional Office in Tyrol.

Which documents do I need to turn in with the application?

Current medical records, e.g. diagnostic results or medical opinions (not older than 2 years), a color EU passport photo in accordance with ICAO regulations, valid residence permit (for citizens from non-EU countries), current care allowance confirmation (if care allowance is received). If you already have a Disability Pass with the additional note "Public transport use unreasonable due to permanent mobility restrictions from disability", then you just need to turn in a color EU passport photo in accordance with ICAO regulations along with your application.

Benefits: Exemption from driving-related insurance taxes, auto club member discounts at ARBÖ and ÖAMTC, Euro-Key – a key to use the restrooms reserved for people with disabilities, usage of facilitated parking (precise regulations § 29b StVO).

Belonging to the Preferred Group of People with Disabilities

In professional life, it may be beneficial for people with disabilities to belong to the preferred circle of people with disabilities. Various support services help in accessing and keeping jobs.

You can find information at <u>www.sozialministeriumservice.at</u> or in personal counseling.

Which requirements must I meet?

Preferred people with disabilities, according to federal law, are Austrian citizens (or equivalent) with a disability degree of at least 50 %.

What do I have to do?

Apply at the Ministry of Social Affairs. Application form online. Application processing is free of charge.

Which documents do I need to turn in with the application?

Current medical records, e.g. diagnostic results or medical opinions (not older than 2 years), proof of citizenship or copy of passport, valid residence permit (for citizens from non-EU countries), current care allowance confirmation (if care allowance is received).

How does belonging to the preferred group of people with disabilities benefit me?

Entitlement special subsidies, special protection from losing employment, and additional vacation – if provided for in the collective agreement, work laws or in company agreements. Employers may receive subsidies and tax benefits when employing workers with disabilities; payment of equality tax ("Ausgleichstaxe") is also eliminated.

Who cannot belong to the preferred group of people with disabilities?

Students, and persons who already receive permanent pension benefits in accordance with federal or provincial regulations and are not employed.

Support Fund for People with Disabilities

Target group:

Grants from the Support Fund for People with Disabilities may be given to persons in social distress.

What does the Support Fund finance?

Subsidies for measures to create accessibility in the private sphere (social distress), grants for environmental catastrophe damages.

Which requirements must I meet?

Residence or permanent residence in Austria, required measures due to disability, disability degree of at least 50 %, net income limit \in 2.060,98 (amount increases per number of dependents/ relatives living in the household) by \in 380, or \in 570 in case of disability (updated 2022), current proof of income must be submitted. Does not count: bonus payments and social benefits, such as care allowance, housing allowance, etc.

Receiving a grant from the *"Unterstützungsfonds"* (Support Fund) is not possible if the monthly net household income is above the maximum contribution basis in accordance with Section 108 (3) ASVG. Submit application BEFORE start of project, at least BEFORE getting a bill!

What can be granted?

One-time financial payment for important disability-related measures. Maximum subsidy amount \in 6000 (updated 2022). The independent decision of the Regional Office allows up to \in 1.817. The Austrian Council for Disabled Persons should be consulted on this..


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
